My thoughts on prayer (by Annelle Waldron)

I don't remember a time when I did not pray. From a little child I was taught to "say my prayers at night" and "ask the blessing for the food" at the table. So, prayer was a part of my life even before I fully understood all about God.

I do not recall how many years of my childhood that was the case; but at some point prayer became mine and not just something I was taught to say. It was something I needed to do. And since that time, prayer has been an ongoing conversation with God. Conversations with people have depended on their availability, but God has always been "available." Whether it is a quick "thank you" when I am working on something difficult to accomplish, or escaping an auto accident by seeing an approaching vehicle just in time to avoid an accident, the awareness of God's presence and involvement in my life has always been real to me.

At times, my conversations are intense! Like when I am struggling over some problem, or a feeling I just can't shake, or experiencing some disappointment, or needing to make a decision that is beyond my wisdom to know how to make at those time, my conversations are serious and focused and often lengthy. And, even after those prayers, I keep my spiritual ears alert for God's answer. I expect that He hears me and will help me. There is a Christian song that says, "Throw back the curtain of memory now and then. Show me where You've brought me from and where I might have been. Remember, I'm human and humans forget. So, remind me, remind me, dear Lord." God does that for me. You know, I've never thought to ask anyone if it's that way for them, but it surely is that way for me. He reminds me.

Out of the blue, I will think of some part of me that I need to ask God to forgive. At times, memories from the past will come to mind. And though I wish I could, I know I can't change the past. (That is even more reason to thank God for His grace, when I remember things I've done or said that I am not proud of.) Any time God brings such things to mind, I ask Him to forgive me and thank Him that I know He does and has.

God also makes me aware of how blessed I am. And when He points out some blessing, I give Him thanks that I am so blessed. I never want to take those things for granted. Back to my beginning thought – my prayers are conversations with my Lord. I know I can talk to Him about anything, and I do. He is as real and vital to me as the air that fills my lungs and gives me life. I can't imagine my life without those conversations. I am so blessed to have confidence that God is always listening and interested.
