Dear Calabash Covenant Presbyterian Church Family and Friends,

Pastors and students of the Bible often see a fourfold history in Scripture.

- 1. Creation
- 2. Fall
- 3. Redemption
- 4. Restoration

Creation refers to God creating the world. By his power and in his love, God created the heavens and the earth (Gen. 1-2).

Fall is the fall of humanity (Gen. 3). Adam and Eve listened to the serpent and trusted him and themselves more than God. The consequences of Adam and Eve reverberate throughout today. Sins are like a chain-link fence. Every link is connected, even if not right next to each other. Furthermore, the sins enclose us. We are stuck in our sins.

We would be stuck in our sins forever if it weren't for God's grace. **Redemption** is the action of God to redeem sinners to himself. It begins when God promises that the seed of the woman will crush the head of the serpent (Gen. 3:15). It continues when God preserves Noah, calls Abraham, delivers Israel, and makes a promise to King David. Yet, redemption is most clearly displayed through Jesus.

If sin is like an enclosed, chain-link fence trapping humanity to hopelessness, Jesus is the gate opening us up to a whole new world (John 10:7). Through the cross, Jesus provides the way to fellowship with God, the new life, and everlasting salvation.

When Christ returns, salvation comes in its fullness. Christ's return inaugurates the **Restoration**, a new heaven and a new earth (Rev. 21:1-6). Creation itself is due for a resurrection to return us to the greater Garden of Eden where fellowship with God is complete and perfect.

This broad story arch of history can be helpful. Sure enough, it provides a framework for reading Scripture. Moreover, it can provide a framework for your own life: the goodness of your creation, the forgiveness of your fallenness, the redemption you have in Jesus, and the full restoration that is yet to come.

May the Lord sustain and guide you in every way.

She recently graduated with honors and she is certain that God has plans for her future. Please read the heartfelt letter below to all of us at CCPC who have prayed for her as she continues to reach her goals.

Friends,

It is with immense gratitude and deep emotion that I send you this message. Thanks to your unconditional support, I was able to realize a dream that was close to my heart: to complete my nursing studies. On January 10, 2025, I had the honor of receiving my diploma, as well as a certificate of excellence, and I am delighted to announce that I passed the national exam with an average of 89/100.

Your generosity and kindness have allowed me to progress and achieve this goal. I would like to thank you from the bottom of my heart for your commitment and your confidence in me. Your support has been an essential pillar in my journey, and I am deeply touched by your involvement.

As for my professional project, I would like to continue my studies and find a job to be able to meet certain daily needs. My desire was to complete a master's degree in midwifery or nurse practitioner. But, for now at FSIL the option available to me is education (nurse educator). The dean encourages us to follow this path, because our country urgently needs well-trained nurses to educate and train future generations.

Regarding the master's degree in teaching, it should start in December, but due to the change in the graduation date, it will finally start at the end of this month.

Currently, I am looking for a job in hospitals, but the situation is complex. Due to traffic problems, many health professionals remain in Léogâne, which overloads the city's health structures and makes it difficult to hire new graduates.

I have not yet received my graduation's photo, because the photographer is not yet ready to provide them to us. I will send them to you as soon as they are available.

I love you with all my heart and I send you my sincere thanks. I am proud of myself, but also proud of you, because without you, this success would not have been possible.
