# Shore Lines June 2024



On Sunday September 8, 2024, we will invite the community to our Kickoff Sunday. It will include:

- Tailgate at 8:00 a.m.
- Worship at 9:30 a.m.
- Ministry Preview at 10:30 a.m. (aka Rally Day)

My previous Shorelines article talked about Kickoff Sunday as a genuine act of Christian hospitality. We are inviting people to fellowship with us, and we are attempting to meet them where they are with our 8:00 a.m. tailgate.

In my article today, I want to pose a question that applies to Kickoff Sunday and every other Sunday too.

My question is: How should we extend hospitality to visitors during a worship service?

I cannot thoroughly answer this question in my brief Shorelines article, but I want you to consider the complexity of it. It's something that I must address as your pastor; furthermore, it is something that every Covenant Partner must address in his or her own heart.

Here are my suggestions and considerations.

**Welcome visitors personally.** This is the most obvious aspect and probably the toughest. There are numerous obstacles to welcoming visitors personally, but just keep it simple. When you notice a new person, thank them for being with us and assure them that they are welcome.

**Find connections without compromise.** There are ways that you can connect with visitors, even non-Christian visitors, without compromising biblical truth and the Gospel.

**Desire evangelism and edification.** Worship services are for the Church. They are meant to edify and encourage Christians, and they are an opportunity for those who are curious about faith in Christ to investigate and learn. Worship services should be accessible and educational.

**Display our love, fidelity to Christ, and our Spirit guided commitment to Scripture.** Our love of God and others should be clear. Our faithfulness to Christ and our adherence to Scripture should be demonstrated in practice through Scripture readings, singing, and prayer.

**Be casual and reverential.** People need to know that we are flesh and blood sinners just like them with struggles and challenges. We should not create a "holier than thou" atmosphere. At the same time, worship services must be reverential unto God. This paradox leads me to my Kickoff Day conundrum. In the theme of the day, in the spirit of welcoming (hopefully) all sorts of people, should I preach in a football jersey? The football jersey makes a kind of "every-man" statement. I am like every other person with hobbies and interests, yet clothes and hobbies don't matter like the Word of God does. When I pick up the Bible that morning and demonstrate my love of Jesus that transcends my hobbies and my wardrobe, could that connect with a non-Christian in a refreshing way? Is that meaningful, powerful, or a stretch too far? What do you think?

### **Fervent Prayers**

Several years ago, my husband, Mike, began to experience mild stomach pains. There were several different thoughts on why he was experiencing these pains, but nothing conclusive, and certainly nothing serious.

After several weeks of these abdominal pains, one Saturday afternoon, he began to have very severe pain, chills, nausea. It was a Saturday, and neither of us were looking forward to a visit to the emergency room on a weekend, but we quickly headed that way. After prompt attention by the staff and a CT scan, the emergency room doctor told us that he had acute perforated appendicitis which required immediate surgery. The surgeon warned us that this could be a very serious situation depending upon what he found when he did the surgery. As they took Mike into the operating room, my prayers began. I also started to contact many of our family and friends for prayers.

One of these prayer warriors stood out to me. My best friend of many years, Helene -- a woman who has guided me in my walk with Jesus -- replied to my text by saying, "I will pray each time God places Mike's name on my heart." The thought of Helene praying for Mike throughout the day each time God placed Mike's name on her heart overwhelmed me. I became tearful, but joyful. My body got chills, but I felt the warmth. I just couldn't believe that somebody would do that for us. Oh my goodness, what a beautiful feeling. Prayers prevailed, and after about 10 days in the hospital, Mike came home healthy and well.

I will never forget the comforting, peaceful feeling of Helene's prayers. I have used this in my own prayers for those who are experiencing extraordinary pain, both emotional and physical. When I read the term "fervent prayers," this is my experience of the joy bestowed upon those for whom we pray for fervently.

And lastly, at times of my own fears and frustrations, I have fallen upon the following scripture (Thank You, Navigators!):

**Philippians 4:6-7**, Don't worry about anything, but in everything, through prayer and petition with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. <sup>7</sup> And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

#### **INVITATION TO PRAYER**

Praying Scripture-Receive the Word, Reflect Quietly, Respond in Grace and Humility Praying Psalm 25

Psalm 25 gives us three simple, yet powerful prayers. Prayers that have the potential to change your heart and your life – if you'll allow your heart to believe and submit to God's will.

## 1) In you, Lord, I put my trust: Psalm 25:1-3

In You, Lord my God, I put my trust. I trust in you, do not let me be put to shame nor let my enemies' triumph over me. No one who hopes in you will ever be put to shame, but shame will come on those who are treacherous without cause. (NIV)

Pray these verses to put your trust in God, releasing your control over a situation or decision you're facing. Pray for unwavering trust in God and steadfast confidence that he will walk with you through whatever you're facing.

# 2) Make me and lead me, O Lord: Psalm 25:4-5

Show me your ways, Lord, teach me your paths. Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Savior, and my hope is in you all day long. (NIV)

Pray these verses to submit your plans to God. Pray to release your own attempts to control your life and allow God to lead you. Ask God to show you the path to His better future for your life, for he is the God of your salvation and the one who wants the best for your life.

#### 3) Forgive me, Lord Psalm 25:6-8

Remember, Lord, your great mercy and love, for they are from of old. Do not remember the sins of my youth and my rebellious ways; according to your love remember me, for you, Lord, are good. (NIV)

We all sin. That's the base of the human condition. We turn from the path he sets before us. We make mistakes. Yet we serve a God full of grace and mercy. He will guide the humble and forgive our sins if we'll just admit our wrongs.

Pray over the areas in your life where you've stumbled and detoured from God's path, where you've fallen short of all God desires for your life. Own up to your sins and ask God's forgiveness. Ask him to show you a better way and to help you move forward. \*
