Dear Calabash Covenant Presbyterian Church and friends,

To bless and to bear, they are not the usual ways we articulate evangelism, but I find them helpful. They are biblical words, good words for the disposition of a Christian to the world around himself or herself. When I think of some of the wonderful ways Christians have shared the Gospel, I can be intimidated. "I am no Billy Graham," I think to myself.

#### To Bless

To bless someone though sounds possible. When God called Abraham, God promised to bless him so that he could bless the world (Genesis 12:1-3). The promises to Abraham are ultimately fulfilled in Jesus Christ. Jesus is the blessing to Abraham and to us. For those of us who trust in Jesus, we are invited to be blessed and to pass along the blessing of Christ. We can bless others with simplicity and kindness in seemingly ordinary ways with the extraordinary joy of the Gospel. I don't always feel like I can win a debate with a non-Christian, but I do regularly suspect that I can bless them with the compassion of Christ, the kindness of the Father, and the Spirit of Truth.

## To Bear

I feel like there's a real shot to bless the people I come across. Similarly, I feel like I can bear witness. I have heard Christians talk about "witnessing" to others. Often "witnessing" involves a brief presentation of the Gospel to strangers in public places. At least that was my experience of "witnessing." There is nothing wrong with that, but over the years, I have noticed Christians bearing witness in much more natural, organic ways. From my point of view, these organic moments of bearing witness had the hallmark of authenticity. Conversation passes between people, and one mentions prayer, church, or faith. There is no presentation or elevator pitch, just an honest openness about their love of Jesus. The challenge of bearing witness in this manner is that your faith must be real, tangible, and true. To bless and to bear witness is simple, like the Great Commandment (Mark 12:28-34). Love God, and love neighbors. Everything else will fall into place if we earnestly love.

I am not Billy Graham, and neither are you. That's okay. God did not call you or me to be Billy Graham. He called us to follow his Son, to love him, and to love others. Bless the world around you, and bear witness to the one through whom the world is blessed: Jesus Christ.

## INVITATION TO PRAYER

"To be a Christian without prayer is no more possible than to be alive without breathing." Martin Luther

Prayer is not about the words we say or how we say them, but about entering into a conversation with God and sharing our lives with him.

Following are 3 points that might aid you in starting the conversation:

- 1. Relationships are built in the frequency of the conversations (don't limit your prayers to Sundays or bedtime).
- 2. Good conversation is always two-sided (be sure to invite Jesus into the discussions).
- 3. Listening is perhaps the most important part of conversation (we need to believe in prayer, that God is listening to us, that we should stop and listen for Him, and that He will engage with us in the conversation). \*

#### **IMPORTANCE OF PRAYER IN MY LIFE**

As a very young child I remember my twin sister and I being taught to pray together. We prayed before meals thanking God for the nourishment of our food. Praying at night, kneeling beside our beds saying the child's prayer, "Now I lay me down to sleep". This was a special time for us because mother was always a part of our prayer time, and she would have us pray for the safety of our father and his buddies who were serving in the Navy during World War II. Prayer was an important part of our life growing up.

The Apostle Paul says to "Pray without Ceasing". Prayer is simply a conversation with God. It is opening your heart to him and sharing what matters. Time spent with God changes us. It helps us to see the big picture. It reminds us we aren't alone. It affirms that we are loved. His door is always open. Nothing is too large or too small to take to God. When I became a young bride and mother, I soon learned I needed more and more help from God. I wanted my children to grow up knowing God and knowing to open their hearts to Him. Thanks to prayer and Gods help my husband and I were able to be a part of the Christian Youth groups that my children participated in. We all learned together the love that God has for us and what a forgiving God he is.

**Proverbs 16: verse 3** tells us, commit to the Lord whatever you do, and your plans will succeed". What troubles you today? What faces you that stresses you out. Turn them over to Him in prayer saying simply "<u>God, I need you</u> "and trust Him for results. God is always with us, especially when things look the bleakest.

I have served as a care giver twice in my lifetime. First with my son who was severely injured in a motorcycle accident at 21 years old. He was in a coma for 4 months; I sat with him daily praying that God would awaken him. The morning he opened his eyes he was diagnosed with severe brain damage. Too often we fail to see the answer to our prayers because it was not the way we wanted it to be. I remember Garth Brooks song "**Unanswered prayer.** "Words from the chorus reminds us to "remember when you're talking to the man upstairs, just because he doesn't answer the way we hoped, that doesn't mean he doesn't care." I know He answered our prayers now because we still have him, and he is now 66 years old. I also cared for my husband for several years and God took him home peacefully. I could never have taken care of them without God by my side to pray with and seeing that I had the good health and strength to care for them. Prayer is an important part of my life, and I am so thankful that my mother and father gave me the foundation of a Christian home. It was not always easy, but God was there to hear my prayers!
