Dear Calabash Covenant Presbyterian Church and friends,

Matthew 6:25-33 says,

<sup>25</sup> "Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? <sup>26</sup> Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? <sup>27</sup> And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? <sup>[9]</sup> <sup>28</sup> And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, <sup>29</sup> yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. <sup>30</sup> But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? <sup>31</sup> Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' <sup>32</sup> For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. <sup>33</sup> But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.

I wish that I could say I was never anxious about anything. But I worry. Worry reveals a crack in our trust in God. He clothes the lilies. He feeds the birds. He will care for us.

We know he will, but it is hard to resist dwelling on concerning matters.

Jesus provides a tactic to replace our anxieties. Instead of following the worry, he suggests seeking the kingdom of God.

The kingdom of God is ushered in by Jesus. Jesus evokes the Old Testament kingdom but it in a new, heavenly way. It cannot be thwarted or stalled. The kingdom of God survives persecution, exile, and earthly opposition. To date, the kingdom of God is undefeated.

The kingdom recognizes a king. Jesus is that king. Pontius Pilate discerned the kingship of Jesus. Pilate represented the preeminent world force of his day: Rome. Rome was the quintessential earthly kingdom. Pilate tried to give Jesus an out, but Jesus remained quiet and true. The Jewish leaders insisted Jesus be executed. The earthly kingdoms seemed to have won out with Jesus on the cross, yet it was by the cross that Christ saved us.

The kingdom of God is undefeated to date, and the triumph of the cross proves that it will always remain so. For that reason, I will endeavor to seek the kingdom, not feed my worry. I hope the words of Jesus encourage you to do the same.

#### PRAYING FOR THE ELECTIONS

In every election cycle, American Christians face both amazing opportunities and grave dangers. We are privileged to be a part of those who can choose their own leaders. In Paul's great teaching on prayer in 1 Timothy 2:1-4, one of his major thrusts is praying for those in authority. According to Paul's reasoning, we want good government that allows us to live lives that ultimately free us to evangelize to those who are lost. Praying for the electoral process is the first step in seeing the fulfillment of what Paul wrote in 1 Timothy. We should not wait for a leader to be selected before we move into obedient prayer for those in authority. In prayer, we invite the Lord into the process of electing those leaders who will ultimately allow us to "lead peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness" (1 Timothy 2:2, NIV).

So why pray for the elections? There are a number of compelling reasons:

- 1. The Bible commands us to pray for those who are in leadership. This should certainly include those who are vying to become leaders.
- 2. Godly leaders can help slow the erosion of religious liberties in our land. This can provide an increased window of opportunity for the Church to pray and evangelize.
- 3. According to Scripture, "Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a disgrace to any people" (Prov. 14:34, NASB). The selection of leaders who understand and lead according to God's righteous standards can bring great blessing to a nation.
- 4. Scripture also says, "For lack of guidance a nation falls, but victory is won through many advisors" (Proverbs 11:14, NIV). The determination of who leads our nation will also determine who advises that leader and how we are guided. \*

#### **Hope Harbor Home**

Hope Harbor Home, Inc., one of CCPC's local mission partners, helps victims of domestic violence iin Brunswick County. In 2022-23 Hope Harbor provided more than 1,400 nights of shelter to more than 115 women and children in addition to 4.858 documented services provided. Their shelter has 15 adult beds and 5 cribs. They provide advocacy services to more than 1,000 victims and prevention/education to more than 6,800. These are the victims of domestic violence for whom Hope Harbor Home has been a beacon of hope for more than 30 years. Please pray for the victims of domestic violence who receive safe harbor, and for the dedicated individuals who compassionately dedicate their time and professional care to those in desperate need.

Lea Esen and her husband Yigit, missionaries with CRU (Campus Crusade for Christ), are beginning their 4th year of ministry in Chicago at the University of Illinois Chicago (UIC). With the addition of their new official student organization status, they have been able to engage with students in many new ways. In the past few weeks, they have met and engaged with over 900 new students and have been able to have spiritual conversations with many of them and have invited them to their community (Bible study) Groups across the city. Nearly 40 students attended their first Bible study group this fall. They see that God is moving on campuses in Chicago and is preparing these students to respond to Him.
